THE SCHOLARSHIP IS NAMED AFTER THE FOUNDER OF THE PUBLIC LANDS FOUNDATION.

THE SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship consists of the following three elements:

- \$5,000 to be used toward the student's tuition expenses.
- An invitation to attend the next PLF annual meeting with all transportation and living expenses paid.
- The opportunity to "shadow" a local BLM manager for a day.

WHO MAY APPLY

- All juniors, seniors, and masters-level graduate students majoring in a natural resource program or public land policy field.
- Students who demonstrate academic excellence with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0.
- Full time students planning on carrying at least 12 units per semester, or enrolled in a Master's level graduate program.
- Students will also be rated based on financial need, related volunteerism, professional society participation, employment, etc.

ANNUAL COST

- \$10,000 direct awards to two student accounts (\$5,000 each)
- \$500-1,000 per student for travel to PLF annual meeting
- 7ero administrative costs
