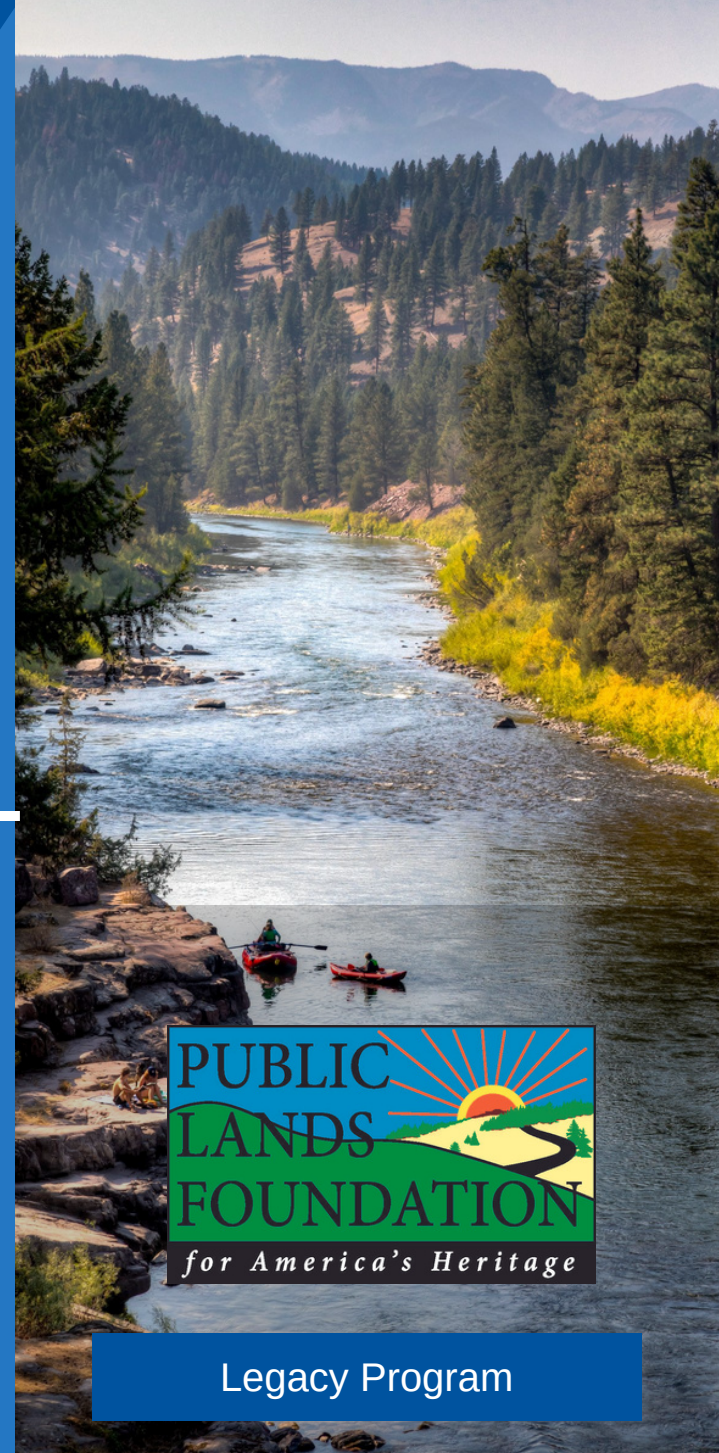

Ways of Giving

There are many ways to recognize the Foundation in your lifetime giving and estate plans. Each has its own tax advantage, which you should discuss with your financial advisor.

*You can name "Public Lands Foundation" as a beneficiary of your will, trust or estate

*You can name "Public Lands Foundation" as a beneficiary in a life insurance policy

*You can name "Public Lands Foundation" as a beneficiary of your retirement such as a TSP or IRA

*You can provide Public Lands Foundation with a gift of stock

*If you are 72 you can gift a Qualified Charitable Distribution as a portion of your minimum withdrawal

*You can name Public Lands Foundation as your selected charity for memorial gifts
