

Updated Statement of Support for Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Employees March 2025

The Public Lands Foundation (PLF) is continuing its efforts to support the employees of the Bureau of Land Management. We believe wholeheartedly in the worth of those who manage America's public lands for the benefit of current and future generations. To demonstrate our commitment, we have engaged with leadership at both the Departmental and Bureau levels and will continue to do so.
